

MGC July 8th Meeting Report

The 2004-2005 officers of MGC were installed at the July 8th meeting as July is the beginning of the fiscal year of the council.

Randy Riley gave the Library Update. Ontario Vital Records are now on the shelves. Purchases for the Michigan Collection continue at a slower rate. Pro-Quest of Ann Arbor now has the partnership to provide services. Remote access will probably not be available. The Burton Collection now charges a fee of \$100 for non-residents to use the collection. Single day user fee has not been decided. October is Family History Month with 35 events planned.

Dave Johnson gave the State Archive Update. Fifty county's Naturalization Records are now at the archives, with complete indexes for 25 counties. Also on the website and eight counties are ready to be put on the website. The actual record for Deaths 1867-1897 are now on microfilm. He gave a progress report on the from Abrams Foundation for grant microfilming of the State land patent records scanning the actual record and the index. Also in process is the World Property project done by WPA 1936-1942 which is indexed geographical coordinates, not alpha.

The <u>Lucy Mary Kellogg Award</u> will be presented at the September 9th meeting.

The <u>November meeting</u> will be Nov. 4th due to the closing of the Library on Veterans Day. It will be held in the <u>Ontario Room</u>.

INTERNET TIP OF THE DAY

While searching on the Internet, are you afraid you will miss the one name you're hunting on a page? Solution: In many programs look at the top left of the computer screen (monitor) and click on EDIT, which will provide a drop-down menu. Select FIND ON THIS PAGE, (or find in top window), which gives you a small box with a search window. Enter the search word or words in the window and hit ENTER. The search will find all the words on that page that you requested – one by one.
