
Since this is our society we as your new board need your input as to

Annual dues for the year, beginning September 1, are \$18 for members choosing to receive **Generations** through postal mail or \$15 for members electing to receive the newsletter via e-mail. Memberships are accepted year-round; dues received after May 1 will pay for the following year's membership. Members receive **Generations** newsletter six times per year. All are invited to submit articles to the **Generations** editor. Permission is granted to reprint articles unless otherwise noted. Please give appropriate credit to the source. Copies of pages from back issues of **Generations** are available for \$1.00 for the first page and \$.50 for each additional page. CCGS 25th Anniversary

The Calhoun County Genealogical Society (CCGS) will be celebrating its' 25th anniversary on Tuesday, October 22nd at 7 p.m. during their regular meeting. Members and guests are invited to attend the meeting at Albion District Library, 501 S. Superior St, Albion, Michigan as we celebrate our anniversary. The Albion Library has been an important part of the society's history. Seminars and meetings have been held there throughout the past twenty five years.

The Calhoun County Genealogical Society's (CCGS) early history is tied to the Family History Library in Salt Lake City, Utah when six Albion researchers met while doing research at the library and decided that Calhoun County needed a genealogical society. CCGS was founded in 1988 with 11 founders and incorporators. There were 98 charter members of the CCGS.

The Founders of the CCGS were Patricia Geyer, Valerie Radee, Marilyn P. Hennon, Joan Von Holten, Margaret M. "Peggy" Sindt, and Martha Smith. The Incorporators included the six founders and Marlene L. Plassman, Helen L. Radee, Ramona Short, Mary T. Dunes and M. John Fox. In addition, the CCGS has four Honorary Life Members: Verla Potts, Ruth Kaiser, Georgia Brown(deceased) and Hazel Miller(deceased).

The society has grown to over 150 members throughout the United States. It has been instrumental in preserving the history of Calhoun County. The CCGS has sponsored numerous educational programs and research trips, published monthly newsletters and eleven genealogy related publications, maintained a website, awarded pioneer certificates and microfilmed records of early settlers and residents of Calhoun County.

Our October program will inform participants about the local and family history resources available at the Albion Public Library, including a tour of the local history section. The public is welcome to attend our October meeting and help us celebrate 25 years of serving the genealogical community of Calhoun County.

I look forward to helping people who are as interested in genealogy as I am.

My interest in genealogy began about six years ago when my father wanted to write an auto-biography, but didn't know a lot about his family. I told him I would see what I could find out. Finding his father's WWI draft registration record was all it took and I was hooked.

Researching my family history led me to become the author of three family history blogs:

- 1. **Journey to the Past**: a blog I created to record my journey as I research the ancestors of my eight great grandparents, all who settled in Michigan. Journey to the Past blog was selected as a 2013 Top 40 Best Genealogy Blog by Family Tree Magazine.
- 2. Journey to His Past: a blog I created to record my husband's family history.
- 3. **Journey to My Past**: this is a newly created blog where I am participating in a blog writing series, "The Book of Me, Written by You", which will explore my personal history.

Darlene (Palmiter) Stange

I have always been interested in family history. My Grandma Palmiter was an only child who lost her mother when she was only 21. She was especially attached to her three aunts on her mother's side and was forever talking to me about her family, the Dotys, Richardsons, and Walkinshaws.

Several years ago I began researching the Palmiter family. My Grandfather and his father operated the Palmiter Dairy at 553 Maple Street (N. E. Capital Ave.) by Piper Park from 1922 to 1946, when they sold it to Ashley Dairy. They also had a farm on 14 Mile Road in Convis Township that had been in the family since the 1850s. Both Grandma (Richardson) and Grandpa Palmiter grew up in Convis Township, and when I looked at Plat Maps and Census Reports for Convis Twp. I learned that there were Dotys, Richardsons, Walkinshaws, Palmiters, and Gibbs farms in Convis Twp. Many are buried in Austin Cemetery, Hicks Cemetery, Bellevue's Riverside Cemetery, and Oak Hill Cemetery.

My oldest Michigan ancestor was Enos Palmiter. He was a minister and farmer who moved to Convis Twp. from Ohio in the 1850s. Now that I am retired, I want to research Convis Union Methodist Church records to find out if he had been a minister of that church. I also want to obtain a Pioneer Certificate and will work on that this year. Enos's father was Joshua Palmiter, a soldier in the Revolutionary War. Joshua is buried in Cuyahoga Co., Ohio. I need to secure proof of this relationship so that I can become a member of the DAR.

Work responsibilities kept me from attending CCGS meetings last year, but I retired in September and am looking forward to serving as Recording Secretary this year.
